



General (Ret.) Ronald W. Yates

General (ret.) Ronald W. Yates earned his commission in 1960 upon graduation from the United States Air Force Academy. He has served as a test pilot, program manager for a variety of weapons systems, and as commander of the 4950th Test Wing, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, General Yates also served as Commander of Air Force Systems Command. General Yates is a command test pilot with more than 4,400 flying hours in more than 50 aircraft types, and



flew 100 combat missions in Southeast Asia. General Yates final assignment was Commander of Air Force Materiel Command, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio. Air Force Materiel Command researches, develops, tests, acquires and provides logistics support necessary to keep Air Force units and weapon systems in a state of readiness. In March 1994, he was inducted into the AFMC Order of the Sword. General Yates retired from the Air Force in 1995.


