CHAPLAIN JOHNSON BEGINS UNIQUE
MINISTRY TO ACADEMY GOLFERS

Chaplain Mervin R. Johnson, Director of Cadet Chaplain Activities, announced today that he was starting, and personally conducting, a new type of ministry never before attempted in the United States. "Golfers," said Chaplain Johnson, "have always gotten the short end of the stick. How many clergymen have been with their people on the golf course when they're really needed? How often have they been with their flock when one of them had to make a short putt to win. Loads of ministers have rationalized their failure to meet this need by saying they have to minister to their people at hospitals and mortuaries, but who, then, will be free to serve their people at a time of even greater need? Golfers have been frequently heard to curse God, nature, their fellow man. Some have been even known to call on the devil instead of their maker. My new ministry will make that all a thing of the past."

Chaplain Johnson is at present in the Academy Hospital, recovering from concussion and a serious head wound inflicted by one of his parishioners when a long prayer over a short putt failed to work.

BLACK BISHOP TO CONDUCT MASS

On Sunday, 7 November 1971, Bishop Harold R. Perry, the first black Bishop in the United States will celebrate Mass with black Air Force Chaplains in the Cadet Chapel at 0830 and 1100 hours. Bishop Perry is the Auxiliary Bishop of the diocese of New Orleans, serving as Vicar General to the archbishop.

The Mass will be served by black cadets from the Cadet Wing. The choir will sing the folk music of Fr. Clarence Rivers.

The purpose of the celebration is to provide the wing with another opportunity to appreciate the Black Culture and the dignity of the black man as the personification of his culture.

THE MARIACHIS ARE COMING ! ! !

On Sunday, 24 October, Mr. Dan Silva will present music for the 1100 Mass, which will highlight the Pan-American flavor. The Ensemble will feature the sounds of Brazil, Argentina, and Mexico, which reflect the Latin, Black, and Indian cultures.

The popular group was founded by Mr. Silva in 1968, and tours extensively in the Rocky Mountain region. Twelve musicians produce the Mariachi sound, and twenty-five sing the catchy melodies in Spanish.

The group is ecumenical, including representatives from all races and religions

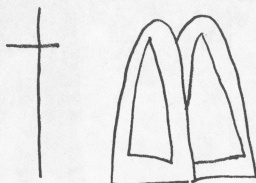

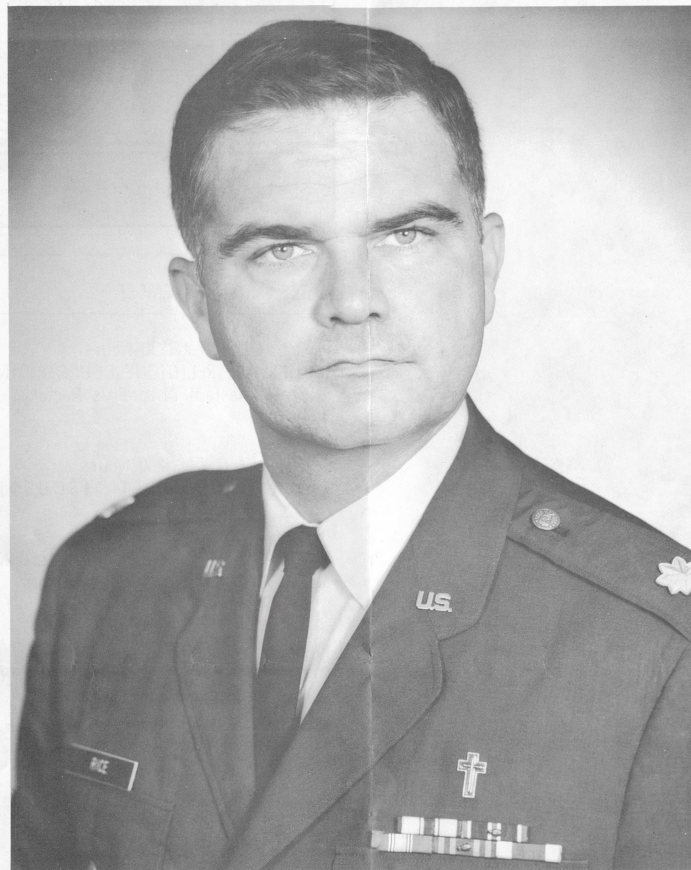

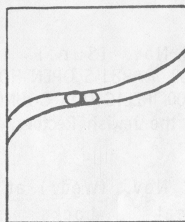
PLAYBOY OF THE MONTH



Chaplain Jerry Rice

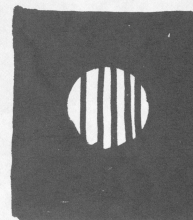
