Dr. Harvey Cox, Professor at the Harvard School of Theology, and author of the Secular City and The Feast of Fools, two of the most influential books in the current theological renaissance, was the guest of the Academy recently at a party held in the newly decorated facilities of the Air Police on campus.

Accompanying Dr. Cox on his whirlwind tour were several priests, nuns, and ministers serving churches and schools here in Colorado.

The climax of their trip, according to Dr. Cox, was a reception held for him and his colleagues at the Security Police Headquarters. Entertainment was provided for several members of his group when pictures were taken of them.

Forced to leave, after only two and one-half hours on campus, because of a speaking engagement at the Colorado College, a school of higher education located in Colorado Springs, Dr. Cox bid a sad farewell to the Academy.

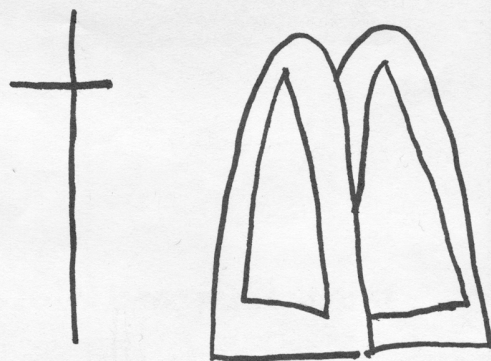

PLAYBOY OF THE MONTH

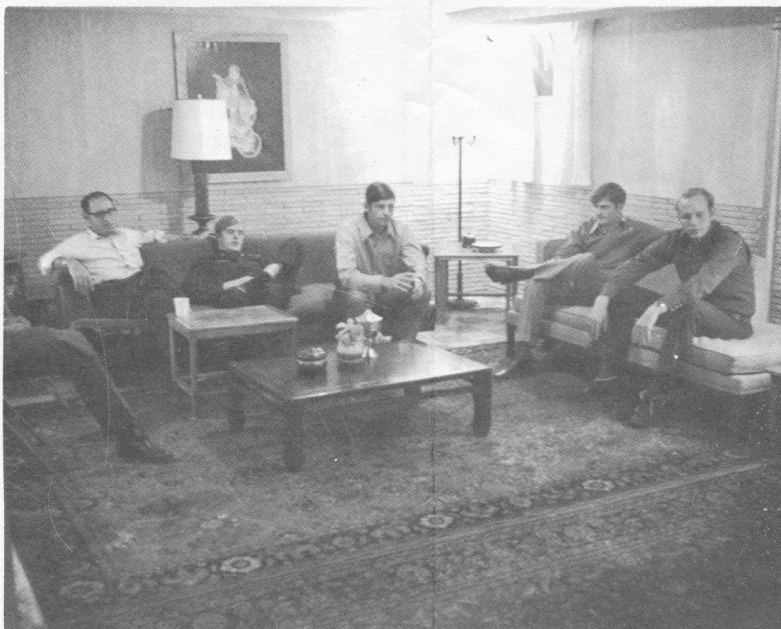

BISHOP PERRY VISITS THE AF ACADEMY

The Air Force Academy was privileged to have in our midst on November 7th Bishop Harold R. Perry S.V.D. for the Catholic Sunday morning Masses, and after the last Mass and Protestant service he rapped with the Cadets in the Fourth Class Lounge of Arnold Hall on an individual basis.

In 1963 he became the first Negro to deliver the invocations on opening session of a United States Congress. In 1964 he was appointed the first Negro major religious superior of men in the United States. Late in 1965 he was appointed auxiliary Bishop of the New Orleans Archdiocese. In January Bishop Perry became the first definitely recognized Negro ever consecrated a Catholic Bishop in and for the U.S. Some of the following appointments and honorary degrees indicate the scope and ability of this man of God:

Archdiocesan Coordinator of Studies, Supervisory Board of St. Joseph's Seminary College, Board of Trustees, Xavier University, National Board of Urban League, National Board Catholic Interracial Council, United Fund, Director Archdiocesan Human Relations Commission and Vice-Chairman of the Louisiana Commission of Law Enforcement and Administration of Criminal Justice. Also, Special Consultant, U.S. Air Force Human Relations Council.

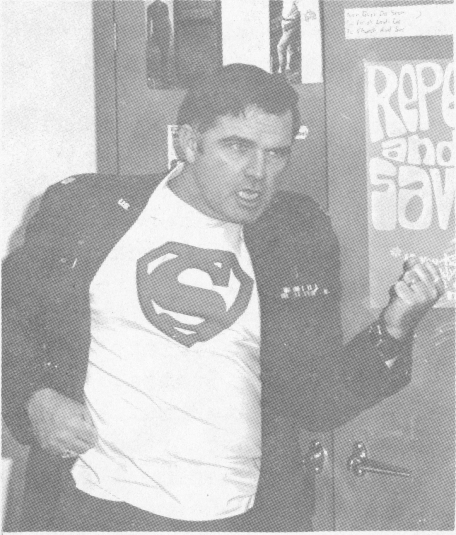
These statements and rumors will be the topic of discussion at the first Protestant Marriage Survival Seminar to be held in Arnold Hall on 24 January 1972.

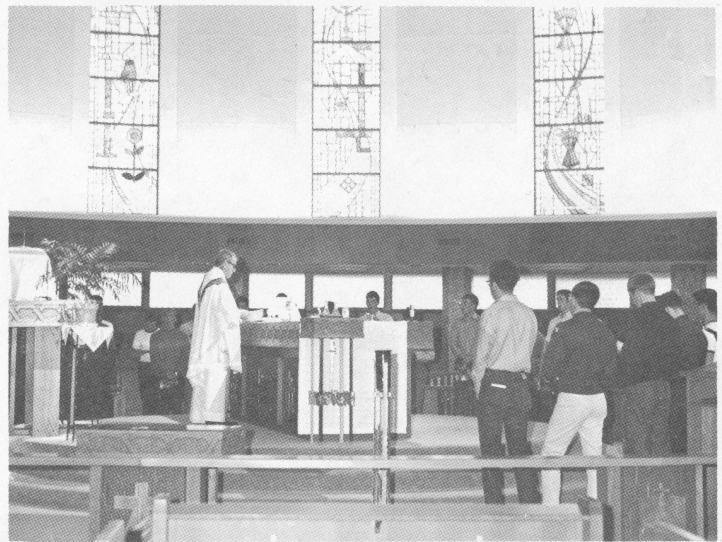

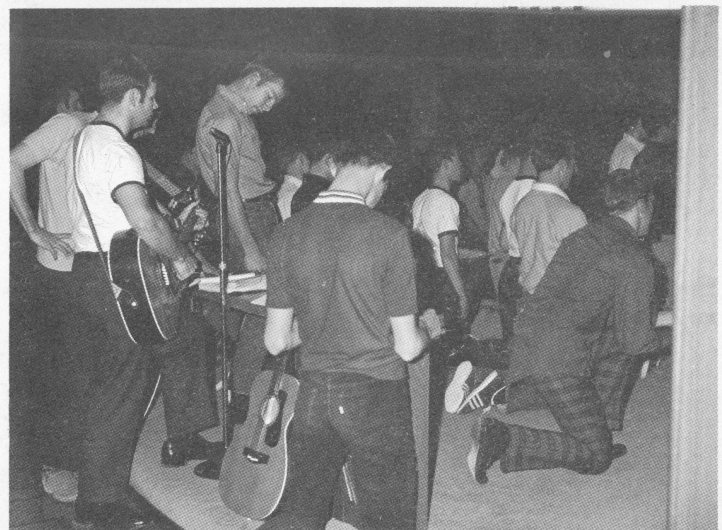

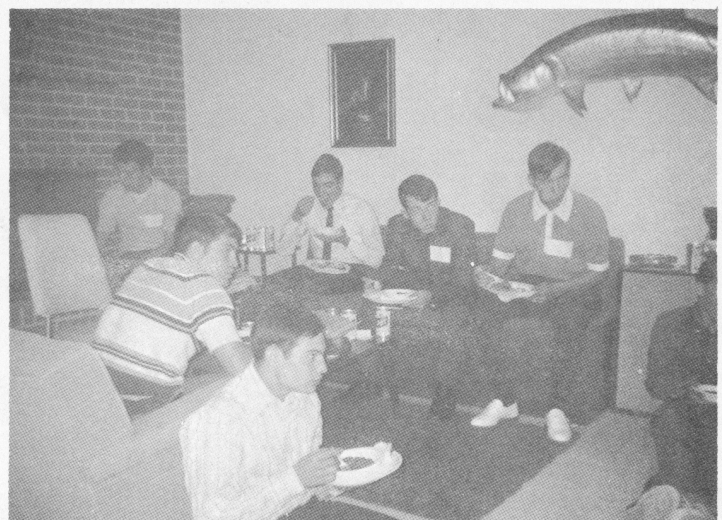
