

In order to acquaint you with the ministers who will be resource leaders for the retreat 28-30 January 1972, here is a brief sketch of each. Dr. Charles Blair, originally from Oklahoma, came to Denver Calvary Temple in 1947. His background is Methodist although the program of Calvary Temple is completely interdenominational. The church supports over 88 missionary families in 50 countries. Dr. Blair has preached crusades in South America, Japan, Hong Kong, Africa, Russia and leaves for India following the retreat. His weekly television program reaches over 100,000 viewers in the Rocky Mountain Region. Chaplain Charles Hudson is sponsored in the Air Force by the National Baptist Convention. Serving over 7 years as a navigator in SAC before entering the ministry, Chaplain Hudson is no newcomer to military duty. As a chaplain he served Lowry AFB, Denver, and Johnston Island in the South Pacific before coming to the Academy in March 1971. Chaplain Hudson graduated from Vanderbilt Divinity School and is a native of Nashville, Tennessee. His duties at the Academy are in the Community Center Chapel.

Fr. Joseph A. Francis, S.V.D., is the celebrant and preacher for the Sunday Morning Masses (8:30 and 11:00 a.m.) during the Black Arts Festival, 16 January 1972.

Fr. Francis, Provincial Superior of the Divine Word Missionaries' Western Province, USA, was born in Lafayette, LA. He attended parochial elementary school in Lafayette and entered the Seminary of the Divine Word Missionaries in Bay St. Louis, MS. in 1936.

Fr. Francis completed his college work at St Mary's Seminary, Techny, His philosophical and theological studies were completed in Bay St. Louis, where he was ordained in 1950. Fr. Francis spent one year as an instructor in St. Augustine's Seminary in Bay St. Louis. He received his M.A. from the Catholic University of America and has done advanced work at Xavier University, New Orleans, LA; Mount St. Mary's in Los Angeles; and Loyola University in Los Angeles.

In 1952 he was appointed Assistant Director of Holy Rosary Institute in Lafayette, LA, where he coached basketball and baseball, taught English, French and history, and directed the boys department of the boarding school. In 1960 he was made administrator of a parish in Austin, TX. From Austin he was assigned as an instructor at Pius X High School in Downey, CA.

In 1962 he was named principal of Verbum Dei High School in Los Angeles. On 16 June 1967 Fr. Francis was appointed Provincial of the Divine Word Missionaries' Western Province.

The Divine Word Order has missions in 41 Mission Territories, Europe, and the United States. Among the members of the Divine Word Missionaries are one Cardinal, three Archbishops, nineteen Bishops, two thousand seven hundred sixty priests and one thousand thro seventy-three brothers

Fr. Francis' Province covers ten Western States. He is responsible for the spiritual welfare and support of forty-one priests and nine brothers. He is a Member of the USCC Advisory Council and an Executive Board Member of the Conference of the Major Superiors of



Chaplain, Colonel, Edward R. Lawler, a Paulist Father in the Professional Division, Office of the Chief of Chaplains, USAF, is the director for the Catholic Cadet Retreat scheduled for 28-30 January 1972 at Mt. St. Francis Monastery.

Fr. Lawler was born in Philadelphia, PA, attended St. Charles College, Catonsville, MD together with the Paulist Father novitiate, Oak Ridge, NJ, and St. Paul's College, Washington DC, where he was awarded B.A. and M.A. degrees.

Ordained a Paulist Father in 1944, he was assigned to Lubbock, TX and Old St. Mary's Church, San Francisco, CA, where he directed Catholic Action and The Adult Education Center.

Fr. Lawler entered active service in the Air Force as a commissioned chaplain in 1952. Among his tours were duty at Webb AFB, Chanute AFB, Sheppard AFB, Eielson AFB, Hamilton AFB, Albrook AFB and U-Tapao AB.

Fr. Lawler also spent four years on the Chaplain Board, Maxwell AFB. His duties included previewing the variety of media which are available as aids in presenting the Christian message with the purpose of recommending appropriate books, films and tapes for use in the AF Chaplaincy.
