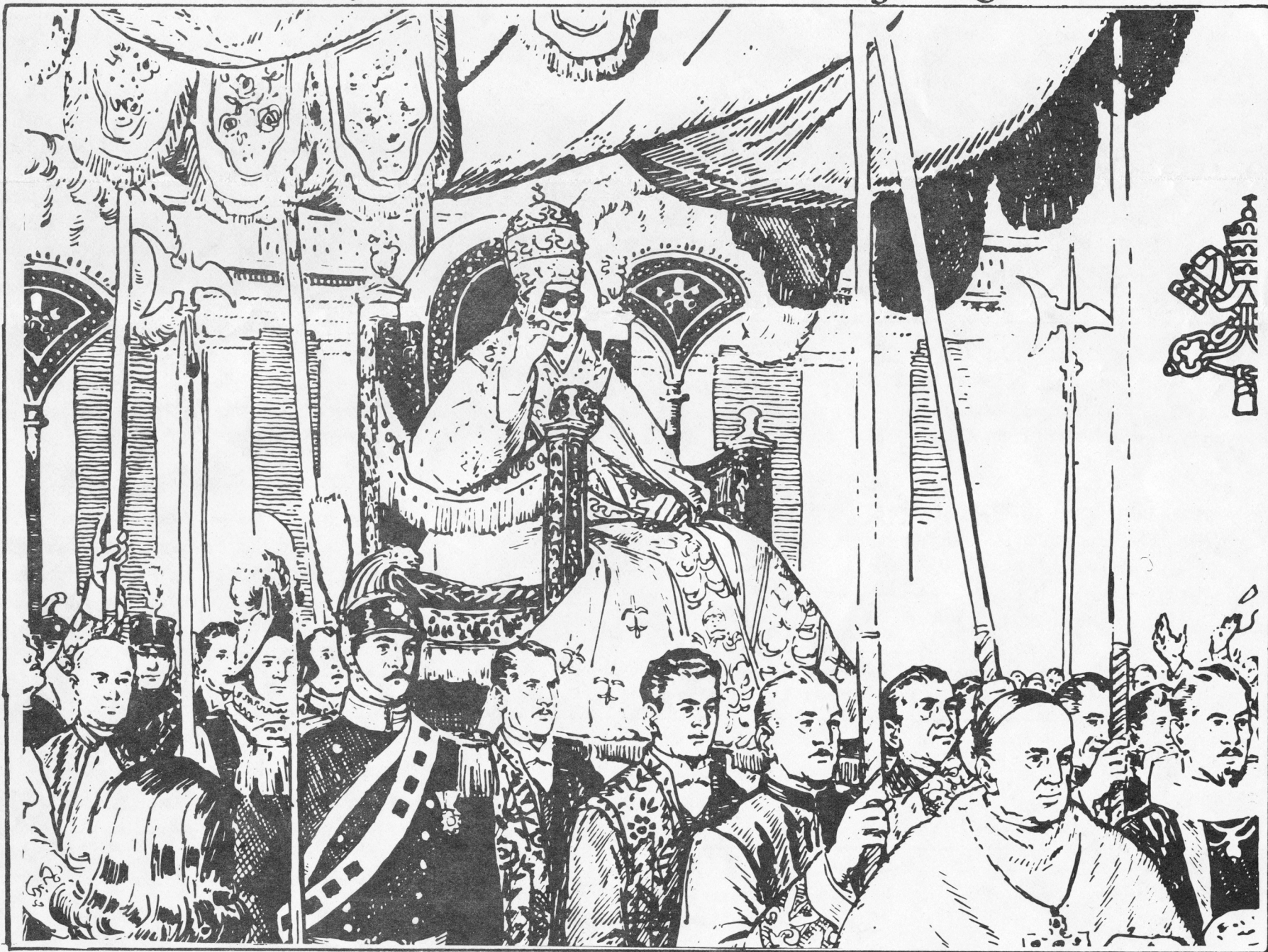

POPE PETER II CROWNED

Pope Peter II, formerly Chaplain Dennis M. Dwyer, is shown being carried on his throne to meet the College of Cardinals after his coronation as Pope. Father Dwyer proved his legitimate claim to the Papal Office after winning a court suit which proved him to be the reincarnation of St Peter, the founder of the Catholic Church. As no cameras were permitted, this artist's drawing attempts to recapture the pomp, pageantry and beauty of the ceremony. Pope Peter announced at this meeting that he had bought the United States Air Force Academy "for their monastic ideals come close to the heart of the original church." He also announced that the former Protestant Chapel would be rededicated to Our Lady of the Skies.

Fr. Dwyer Wins Fight For Papal Office

SUPREME COURT, IN 5 TO 4 DECISION, DECREES HE IS ST. PETER.
BUYS AF ACADEMY AS FIRST STEP IN MONASTIC RENEWAL

"There can be no doubt in our mind that Fr. Dwyer is the re-incarnation of St. Peter, and thus is entitled to be named Pope." This was the majority opinion handed down by 5 members of the U.S. Supreme Court. The College of Cardinals, meeting in emergency session, accepted the decree, and immediately named Fr. Dwyer Pope.

After the coronation, the new Pope announced that he would take the name Peter, "for, after all, that is my real name." He also announced that he had bought the AF Academy, "because, in this age of church renewal, it is necessary to change the notion of monastic living, and the Academy is way ahead of all other institutions in promoting the monastic life." "The typical cadet," he said, "is an untoured monk, and they have a lot to teach the church."

"We do have some changes planned for the school in line with the church's emphasis on a theology of liberation. They are minor, however, and I can't see anyone objecting to them. These changes include: (1) The admission of female cadets, who will be known as sisters; (2) optional marriage for seniors; (3) automobile privileges for all cadets. We also envision a few changes in the Chapel set up. The former Protestant Chapel will now be Catholic, and the new Command Chaplain will be Rabbi Helman. The Chapel change over is natural, because the school is now an extension of the Vatican, and the command change is because the Rabbi is my second cousin, once removed."

In a series of interviews with Academy personnel, your COP reporter elicited the following responses to this new development in Academy and church history. In response to the question, "What do you think of Chaplain Dwyer's being named Pope and buying the Academy?" -

General Vandenberg said: "Chaplain WHO?"

Mrs. Denehy, mother of the former Command Chaplain, said, "Fr. Dwyer is a sweet boy, and I don't presume to challenge the decision of our Supreme Court or of the College of Cardinals, but if he's the re-incarnation of St. Peter, I hesitate to tell you who my son John is the re-incarnation of. I've known who John really is for a long time, but in His humility He refuses to let me tell the world until it's ready for Him."

"I Drove My Child to School"

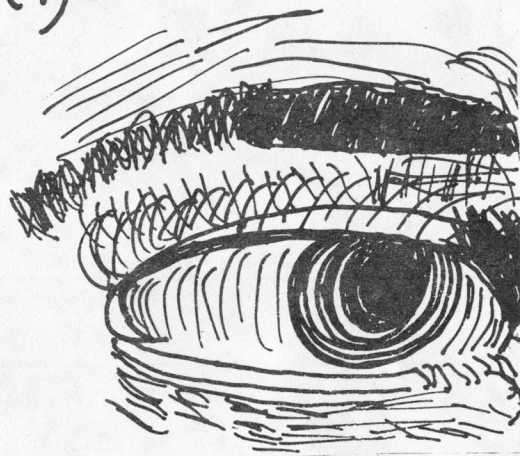


CHAPLAIN JOHNSON says: "I had to do it. The flippin bus didn't come."

Denehy, a precocious student, was in school when the stock market crashed in 1929. "It was mighty different then," he says. "No miracle fabrics or detergents, and loads of unpaved roads. I went to school on an ox-cart, and had to feed the oxen during school recess."

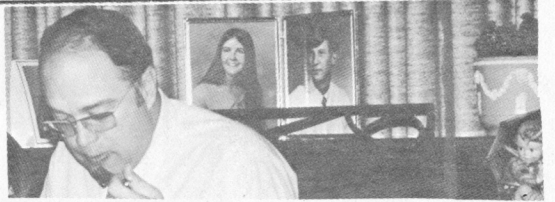

Chaplain Cooks Dead Chicken, Feeds It to Cadets.

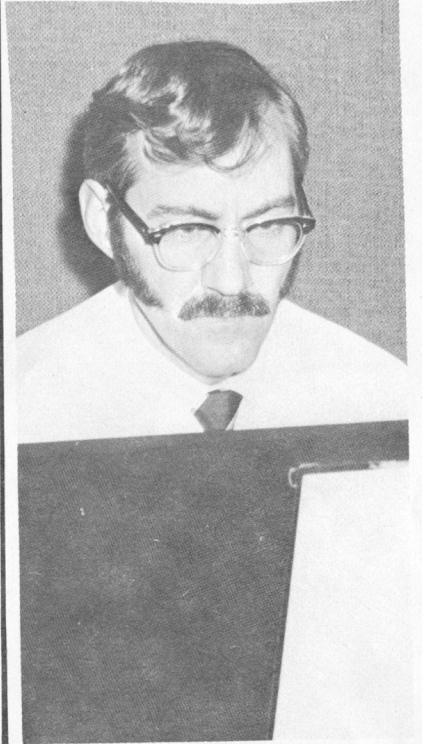
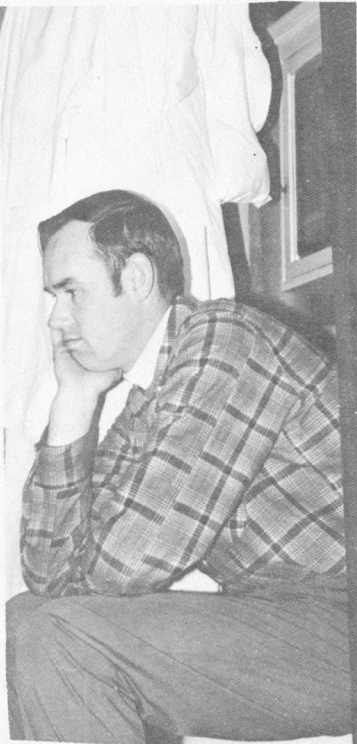
"I Used The Bones For Soup," He Admits.
