
Part Four: Descent Into Madness

As time passed and grunge music became popular, it suddenly became cool to be a pessimist. The Dodo became a little more bitter and that was probably for the worst.



LAS: Neither Cool nor Fun; Study Shows

VANDENBERG TOWER-A recent study conducted by C2C Edmund Peabody has confirmed what all cadets seemed to regard as truth; the Leader Attribute Survey (LAS) is neither cool nor fun.
