


She has dated cadets before and is presently available, (for those who need to research for their composition course)


The falcon runners leave the tired Bruins gasping for air.



In the opening period, the powerful Bruins plunged deep into USATA territory on three separate occasions, only to be repelled each time by a spirited Academy defense.

Sophomore Terry Isaacson was the sole bright spot on the Falcon offense, gaining 81 yards in thirteen carries. Terry also nabbed two Joe Rodwell passes for an additional 17 yards.

Falcon coach Ben Martin contributed an all-out effort to his chargers, stating that he couldn't find any fault in their efforts. "We couldn't play any better than we did, "he said.
