Bob Strickland, coach of the cadet kickers, brought his charges through a 7-3 season to a co-championship of the Rocky Mountain Intercollegiate Soccer League in '62, and the squad looks even better this year. Co-captains Jim Renschen and Don Hiede bring

Junior Dan Holoviak is being counted on to continue as one of the top goalies in the area. The remaining starting slots should go to two other talented juniors, John Gritsavage and Harry Rodman at the fullback spots and senior Jim McComsey at a wing. Despite an anticipated improvement in the team's overall strength, improvement upon last year's record, while possible, will be hard to achieve because of an exceptionally tough schedule. The Falcons are slated to meet the 59-60-62 national champions, St. Louis University, in the season opener on 21 September. Also on the schedule are two regional champs, Army and Navy, the latter Southern Independents champions. Coach Strickland expects this season's new style of play to surprise followers of the team. Some changes in both the offense and defense have been made to take advantage of some of the individual talents on this year's roster. The first opportunity to see these changes and this season's lineup will be this Saturday, 14 Sep, in an inter-squad scrimmage. There are also 3 home games on this year's schedule providing ample opportunity to see and support a talented and exciting team. Coach Strickland credited the big turnout and spirit at last year's Satur-

day game with Denver University as a big help in the Falcon's topside position at the final gun, and hopes for the same type of support at this year's games. There appears to be no cause for apprehension on the coach's behalf considering the championship quality of soccer available to the Wing, and opportunity to help


make another championship.


