


A new record was set this weekend when Jim Murphy paced the Falcon harriers to a 28-28 tie with Western Michigan's formidable cross country team. Jim Murphy covered the four mile course in the astounding time of 21 minutes and 14 seconds, at least 400 yards ahead of 2nd place Smith from Western Michigan. It was a perfect day for the record breaking run, sunny and cool, and probably would have yielded an even more outstanding time except that Murphy was hampered by a sore back. Also turning in fine times for the Falcons were Kirk Hall and Jesse Overall placing 3rd and 5th respectively. Overall was in 4th place until the last 600 yards when Brown of Western Michigan put on a final burst of speed to beat the Falcon runner by four seconds. If it hadn't been for this change of position the Falcons would have beaten Western Michigan by 2 points. Much credit goes to the remaining members of the cross country team who put up a hard fight throughout the entire 4 mile course. Western Michigan finished third in the NCAA's last year, so coach Arnisen's boys did a great job. Next week they are headed for the Oklahoma State Jamboree at Stillwater and are expected to literally run away with first place.

Wrapped up in a small (5'4", 130 lb) frame, Jim Murphy has corralled the drive and desire it takes to be an outstanding runner as demonstrated by the two Freshman records he holds in the mile and two mile and the new cross country record he set last weekend. Jim started his brilliant running career at Loyola Academy in the "Windy City". As a 15 year old Sophomore he won the city junior half mile championship (2:00.4) and the senior half mile in a record time of 1:56.9. In his senior

year he won the Chicago cross country title and ran an amazing 4:17.5 mile in the Central AAU Championship. Last year he led the freshman cross country team to an undefeated season and, during track season, grabbed the freshman records mentioned above. This year he and the Falcons appear to be on their way to another undefeated season. Jim hasn't spent all his time at track as can be seen in the star and wreath he wears on his sleeve. He is also a good water skier and ocassionally steals the time to hit a few golf balls around. When asked about his ambitions in the near future he replied that he very much wants to attend the NCAA cross country championships at East Lansing, Michigan, this year.

The soccer team heads for the Pacific Coast this weekend, continuing their tough schedule by taking on Stanford and San Jose State. The Falcons will have no easy time of it against the rugged San Jose State and the '62 western champs, The Stanford Indians, on Friday and Saturday respectively but anyone lucky enough to see the fine soccer game last Sunday will know that we have a good chance to bring home two victories. The Wing will get its next chance to see and support this fine team when they meet Colorado College on Saturday, 12 October, in Colorado Springs.


