




A Day in the Life of a Cadet II

Saturday looms as another day of decision in the '64 Falcons' bid for another outstanding season. Coming off one of the most thrilling and important victories in Academy history, the Falcons must continue their heroics to overcome another "top ten?" opponent; the University of Michigan. On defense Harkleroad's headhunters will have their job cut out for them in stopping the Bob Timberlake led Wolverine offense. The 6'4", 215 lb. quarterback returns along with the rest of '63's starting backfield and 18 other 163 letter winners. Soph speedster Carl Ward has already replaced one of last year's starting halfbacks. Timberlake is a threat both running and passing, while Ward is expected to add to an already imposing set of swift, solid running backs. All-Midwest end John Henderson (6-3, 185 and 163 Big Ten leading pass receiver) returns to snare Timberlake's passes along with Captain Jim Conley. The defense is headed by linebacker Tom Cecchini, one of the Big Ten's best. Michigan's biggest worry is in the interior line where mainly unproven players will be called upon. This should be especially to the Academy's advantage because this game is Michigan's season opener, whereas the Falcons have one game's experience under their belts.

The competition should not be so keen on the weekend following the Ann Arbor affair. The Academy's home season opens with Colorado State here on the third of October. The Falcons will be trying to once again give the Rams a nasty time, but last year's 69-0 margin may not be as easy to come by. Coach Mike Lude's forces have been improving

steadily and should pose more of a threat than in the past, though they were soundly defeated by Wyoming 31-7 in their opener.

194 lb. halfback Norman Burkett raced 14 yards for CSU's lone tally. Burkett who averaged 6 yards per carry last season is the Rams' biggest threat to Falcon fortunes. The two teams are nearly equal in size. The Rams average 208 in the line and 190 in the backfield.

Coming now to the Falcon team, the line-up for Michigan should be almost identical to last Saturday's except for the absence of George Hanseth at tackle due to a knee injury. Despite the loss of one of our finest interior linemen, it seems apparent from the Washington game that the personnel and will are there. Given proper encouragement from the rest of us in the Wing, the will should remain with the personnel to carry the Falcons through the toughest, but greatest, season seen at the Academy.


