

FENWICK FALCON at a FOOTBALL GAME





help himself, so he jumped into the air. Fenwick was excited.





Fenwick was happy at the Club. He found that he could do the "bird" better than any of the other cadets. But the others were doing the jerk.


Then Fenwick felt out of it.


FALCON HALL OF FAME

Meanwhile, Stein (10), who still has the ball, rolls right, runs through the slot, and laterals back to Cook (45), who flips the ball to Manning (41). Manning (41), hands off to Stein (10), who swings back into the backfield and passes downfield to Hogle (44), who has run a clever pass pattern. Hogle (44) scores, naturally.


Blocking Assignments: Gibson (57) and Fallon (61) cross. Each wipes out an opposing guard and linebacker. Mrojek (75) forms a one-man wall for pass protection. 


