

# HAR HOCKEY

OUR GANG - AREN'T THEY INNOCENT - LOOKING ?



Hockey began at USAFA five years ago when several cadets in the Wing showed a remarkable aptitude for sticks and their aggressive uses on ice. A club was formed and a drive began for mean cadets with a desire to kill, plunder, etc. This drive was climaxed with the help of the Comm Shop's recommendation of several undesirables. These cadets found that serving time was much more fun than tours. (NOTE - see rules which follow) "Because of some selective re-(NOTE - see rules which folcruiting in Chicago's East Side and the New York dock area Hockey will soon reach varsity status.

The <u>DODO</u> feels that when a cadet goes to watch a hockey game, he should have some idea of the rules, and the things that are being done on the ice. Therefore in the spirit of the <u>DODO</u> here are a few simple descriptions and regulations which must be known:

Puck - Round black slab strongly resembling a Mitchell Hall Woodcock. Often treated with the same respect.

Goal - Large moon shaped net which is the object of aggression on the ice. The goalie tries to keep the puck out of there.

Stick - Long crook shaped piece of wood with which players try to kill, plunder, maim, etc., each other during the course of the contest. An alternate use for it is strimking the puck. The size of the stick depends wholly on the size of the man.

<u>Icing the Puck</u> - This occurs when one of the players on a team scrapes ice on top of the puck causing its temperature to drop below 0°. The puck is then dropped down the referee's back giving him the "cold shoulder."

<u>Delayed Whistle</u> - Call made by referee when he has missed a play entirely. After the discovery of his mistake icing the puck usually occurs.

Puck out of Bounds - After icing the puck, the player responsible tries to get the puck out of bounds.

Penalty - Infraction of the regulations. The new classification system provides for a slap on the hands for a Class I offense, a crack on the mouth for a Class II and the Penalty Box for a Class III offense. Only 48 Class III's are permitted in one period.

Penalty Box - Area for those players who have received a penalty for causing an "accident" involving the infliction of great bodily harm with or without malice aforethought. This highly competitive honor is meted out usually in 2 and 5 minute increments. Only the most enthusiastic players may be admitted.

Face Off - Occurs when two opposing players have not been able to beat each other to a pulp. This takes place in back of the gym after the game.










