OPERATIONS PLAN "RALPH DAY"


- 1. Glasses will be cancelled for the entire merning, as will the parade, in order to allow a full "Spirit Weekend," GUESTS LIME"

- 6. Hamburgers will be cooked in Jack's Valley beginning at 1800.


 Cadees will arrive at the Valley by means of privately-owned vehicles.

 8. Cadets who wander away from the dancing areas will be left alone.



Next, the assistant editor, Roger A. Dean was presented a yo-yo for his great contributions to the <u>Dodo</u>.




Mike Stevenson energetically accepts the annual Martin, Spear, Rollins award for his work as Sports Editor.

YOUR SPACEMATE




The expression of pride in service to the United States by Chicago Cubs manager, Leo Durocher, "nice guys finish last," is deeply felt by Cadet First Class Jonathan D. Gefernlick, "The amount & man does himself relates directly to the amount of pride he has in mimself, his car, his girl, and his side-burns." This is the strong conviction held by our next wing commander.

After graduation from high school in Sheboygan, Wisconsin in 1923, Jon enlisted in the Merchant Marines and soon found himself part of the 28684792nd Breakfast Detail and Garbage Disposal Squadron, Marker Buoy No. 7, Pt. Barrow, Alaska.

After many years of trail and tribulations he decided he was in the wrong career field. So, in 1959 he transferred to the US Air Force (a new and growing field, so he heard), where he quickly advanced to Airman Third. Jon finally settled on the AF as the career of the future. In looking for ways to secure a commissioh, he decided on trying for an appointment tobest expressed by his enthusiastic evalthe AF Academy. After 3 years at the Academy Preparatory School, Jon felt honored and privileged to be one of 2 AF regulars to enter the Academy with the class of '68.

Cadet Gefernlick's leadership qualities did not go unnoticed during his first two years here. He received 48 of a possible 49 ratings of 60 on the Form 0-633 Cadet Rating Form and the others rating was 59 (Sixty is perfect). Academically, Fern (as his friends call him) has also done well. In spite of the initial animosity it may cause, all out hatred is reached in a relatively short period of time.

Cadet Gefernlick's sincere interest is uation of the Academy. "It's the chance of a lifetime...too bad everybody can't do it...wouldn't trade it for anything, but make an offer." He is fully aware of the responsibilities of being a cadet in Colorado's greatest tourist attraction. Jon thinks that every cadet feels this pride, but for some strange reason there is a small percentage that isn't inclined to show it.

Jon's future plans include pilot training, at Del Rio, and a chance to get out of Colorado to anywhere warm, probably Vietnam. As he explains it, "The country is committed in Vietnam; in fact there are some people in this country that should be committed somewhere."

The Air Force Academy has been a boon to Cadet Gefernlick and vice-versa. In the words of our next wing commander, "I'm going to be what?"
