



The Falcons started off the '68 season with a bang against Florida. Curtis Martin raced 98 yards with the opening kickoff and then the Gators knew they were in for an afternoon of football.

With Marietta, Epping, and company consistently pulling down the Florida quarterbacks, and Spider and the boys working over the defense, it looked as though the upset of the season was in the making. But no, one puny cloud -the only one in the sky- saw fit to dump on Tampa Stadium and that was the end of the dream. With the final score 23-20, about all that could be said about the Florida team was "If they're #5, we're #6". The next Saturday saw us pitted against the #20 team in the nation, Wyoming. This was also to be a Saturday of the fallen records. Also, that CSU weekend will feature the #1 meet of the cross country season with the top teams from last year running right here at old AFA. 


U.S. NAVY
