## Air Force Approves ROTC for Women

The Air Force has opened its college ROTC program for women who are interested in becoming officers in the Air Force.

Beginning this fall at selected universities, women will be offered the same two-year commissioning program now given for male students.

At first, three universities will have the program but more are expected to be added in the near future. Those already selected are: Ohio State University; Auburn University and East Carolina University.

The coeds must have two years of college remaining at either the undergraduate or graduate level and must attend a six-week training course at an Air Force Base prior to entering the program. Other requirements are to achieve a qualifying score on the Air Force Officers Qualifying Test and meet the physical standards required of a WAF officer.

The women will be entitled to the same benefits afforded male cadets in the two-year program, including a \$50 monthly allowance while enrolled in Air Force ROTC.




## the Denver Laundry


