It's Homecoming for all the Tulsa alumni and the athletic department wants to welcome all the TU grads back to the University and hope you enjoy today's game with the Air Force Academy, another step in Tulsa's climb to a big-time schedule.

The last time these two teams met in Skelly Stadium was in 1957 when the Air Force Academy was a fledgling university nestled in the scenic Rocky Mountains near Colorado Springs. TU won that first encounter, 12-7. The Falcons, soaring to the pinnacle of college football under coach Ben Martin, winged past the Hurricane, 23-7, in the second encounter at Air Force, tying the series at 1-1.

Both teams are trying to break out of a tailspin today, the Falcons hoping to snap a two-game losing streak which dropped their record to 5-3; Tulsa needing to halt a four-game skid which dragged TU's mark to 3-5 with the last two games on the road.

Today's game will be the final Skelly Stadium appearance for 19 seniors on the TU roster. They are: guard Lindsay Anthony, tackle Phil Ashcom,

tackle Jean Barrett, linebacker Dick Blanchard, end Jim Butler, tackle Gary Christensen, guard Rick Ewing, center Tom Hunt, safety Jon Long, guard Louis McGee, cornerback Ralph McGill, safety Jim Morgan, fullback Dave Nowaskey, end James Shaw, halfback Johnny White and linebacker Pedro Williams. Also three seniors have been sidelined with injuries: halfback Bill Robey, safety Jim Stuemky and tackle Andy Teachman.

Coach Claude Gibson said he looks for an inspired finale from these seniors to help snap the Hurricane out of the recent slump, pointing out how much this group has helped the TU football program swing upward.

Air Force, trying to regain some interest from the bowl selection people, will rely on a balanced attack with Rich Haynie at the controls. Haynie has hit on 71 of 172 passes for 1,090 yards and seven touchdowns this season. End Paul Bassa has taken 23 of those passes for 466 yards. Tailback Brian Bream is the workhorse on the ground with 625 yards on 182 carries.

Tulsa will counter with Todd Starks

leading the aerial attack. The junior quarterback has 1,175 yards on 105 of 197 passes with Jim Butler leading the receivers with 36 catches. TU, however, must come up with a more balanced attack and that means more running. Mike Ridley currently leads the rushers with 287 yards, less than half what Air Force's leader has.

Ralph McGill, who already owns several school records for punt returns and kickoff runbacks, has a chance to set another today. He needs only four punt returns to match Clyde LeForce's record of 29 in a season and one more kickoff return to catch up with the 17 that Harry Wood returned in 1966.

All the action planned for Homecoming '71 won't be confined to the game, however. There will be plenty of excitement and entertainment in the pre-game and half-time shows, from the TU marching band, the Air Force drum and bugle corp, the Falcon show and, of course, all the other festivities that go with homecoming. 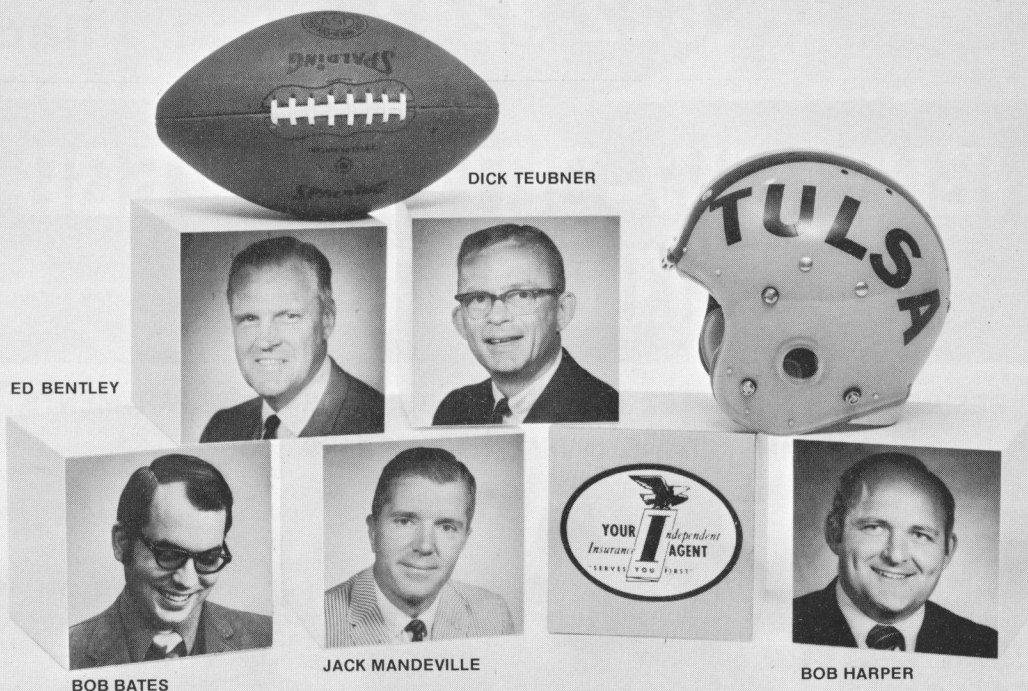

VICE PRESIDENTS of the University of Tulsa



JOHN A. HAYES, Vice president for business and finance

John A. Hayes joined the University of Tulsa administrative staff as an accountant in 1948. In 1968 he was named vice president for business and finance. In those intervening years as he assumed greater responsibility he saw the University become more complex and a tremendous expansion in the physical plant.

Asked to describe his job as vice president, Hayes, a man of few words, replied, "Isn't the title enough?"

He does have the responsibility for the overall fiscal operation of the University, which includes maintenance of the physical plant.

It is, he admits, a "tough" job.

A native of Florida, he was graduated from Baxter Springs High School in Kansas and from Kansas State Teachers College. He has done graduate work in the college of business administration at the University and has participated in a special program at the University of Omaha.

Between 1948 and 1968, Hayes was successively named assistant business manager (1951), business manager and assistant secretary-treasurer (1952), and treasurer (1957) for the University.

He is secretary of the board of trustees of the University and is a member of the boards of Blue Cross-Blue Shield, Tulsa Teachers Credit Union, Tulsa Area Health and Hospital Planning Council, and the Hurricane Club. He is a member of the National Association of College and University Business Officers and of the Oklahoma State Business Officers Association, which he has served as president. Hayes is also a member of Sigma Phi Epsilon, Newman Club, and Phi Mu Alpha.

He and his wife, Helen, have eight children. They are Kathleen, Kevin, Robert, Susan, Margaret, Sharon, Michael and Elizabeth.

DR. CLIFFORD HUTTON, Vice president for student affairs

Clifford E. Hutton returned to the University of Tulsa this fall to become vice president for student affairs, a newly created position. He was associate dean of graduate studies for the college of business administration in 1969 at the University when he resigned to become dean of the school of business at North Texas State University.

His area of responsibility as vice president for student affairs at the University of Tulsa includes student affairs, fraternities and sororities, housing, financial aid, student government, health care, food service, and international students counseling.

Hutton returned to the University, he said, "because of the desire to return to a closer contact with students and their problems."

A native of Dill City, Oklahoma, he received B.S. and M.S. degrees from Oklahoma State University and a Ph. D. from the University of Texas. He taught at Oklahoma State University until 1953 and served as assistant dean of the college of business at Oklahoma City University until 1955 when he joined the University faculty as assistant professor of accounting. Three times during his tenure at the University he was voted by the students in the college of business as the most popular professor.

While at North Texas State, Hutton served as faculty advisor to Blue Key, a leadership fraternity, and the council of business students. He was also vice president of the Southwest Business Deans Association, on the board of directors of the Texas Council on Economic Education, a member of the supervisory committee of Denton County Teachers Credit Union, the accreditation committee of the American Association of Collegiate Schools of Business as well as various other committees and professional organizations.

He is listed in Who's Who in America, Who's Who in American Education, and Who's Who in South and Southwest.

He and his wife, JoRetta, have three sons, Terry, Jimmy, and Ronnie.



DR. JOHN G. DOWGRAY, JR., Vice president for academic affairs

John G. L. Dowgray, Jr., became vice president for academic affairs at the University of Tulsa in August 1969. Within two weeks after assuming his post, he made newspaper headlines and was the subject of an editorial for his stand against the "publish or perish" syndrome prevalent at many colleges and universities.

That philosophy, he believes, has had the effect of encouraging publication for its own sake rather than contributing to knowledge and improving the teaching abilities of the faculty.

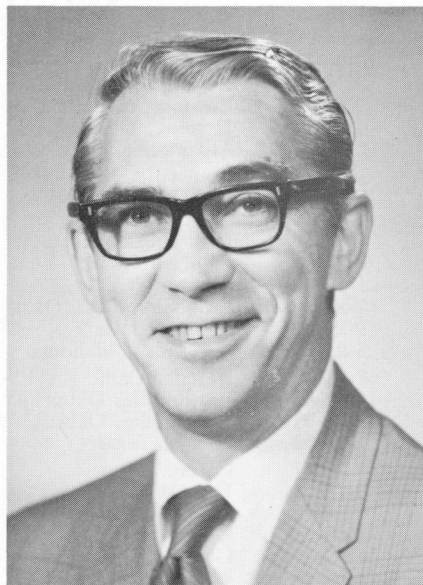
With that statement Dowgray became a favorite of both faculty and students for his emphasis on the quality of teaching.

As the chief academic affairs officer, he is responsible for coordinating and planning the academic program and activities as well as for the departments of the registrar, director of admissions, and director of libraries.

"It is," he said, "a life of meetings with individuals and groups, leavened on occasion by meetings with students. That means a good portion of the buck stops here."

Prior to coming to the University, Dowgray was dean of faculties at the University of Missouri, Kansas City. During his tenure there, he served as assistant professor, associate professor, and then chairman of the department of history; coordinator of graduate studies, acting dean, and then dean of the school of graduate studies; and acting dean and then dean of faculties.

He was graduated from the University of Kansas City in 1947 with a B.A. degree with distinction in history and holds M.S. and Ph. D. degrees in history from the University of Wisconsin. He was an active member in civic, academic, and historical organizations in Missouri. Currently Dowgray is a member of Omicron Delta Kappa, Organization of American Historians, American Studies Association, American Association of University Professors, the Tulsa Chamber of Commerce, and the Downtown Kiwanis Club.

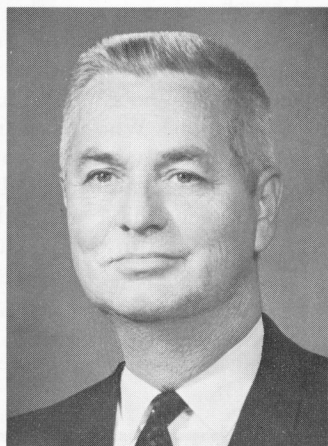

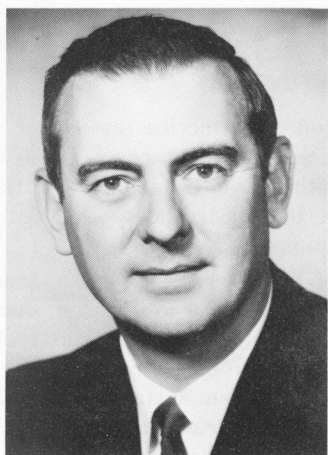

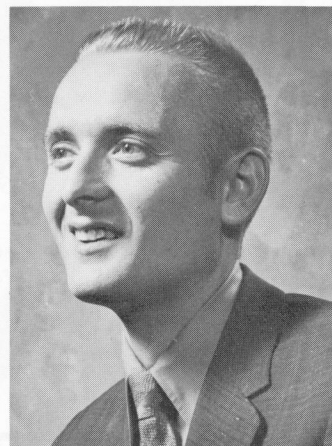

President J. PASCHAL TWYMAN

J. Paschal Twyman became the 18th president of the University of Tulsa in June of 1968. At 37 he is one of the youngest presidents of a major college or university in the country.

Twyman came to the University in 1967 as vice president for research and development from the University of Missouri—St. Louis, where he had been director of research, assistant to the chancellor and professor of education since 1966. At the University of Tulsa he was subsequently appointed vice president for academic affairs in 1968 and served in that position until being appointed president.

Prior to his tenure at the University of Missouri—St. Louis, he was assistant, then associate, director of the Research Foundation, Oklahoma State University, from 1964 until 1966. Previously he was assistant, then associate, professor of education at Oklahoma State University from 1960 to 1964.

A native of Kansas City, Missouri, he was graduated with a bachelor's degree in sociology from the University of Missouri—Kansas City, in 1955. He then earned a masters degree in ed-

ucational administration in 1959, and the doctor of philosophy degree in education in 1962, at that institution.

He has distinguished himself in research and scholarly endeavor; served successfully as a consultant to several educational and corporate organizations; and contributed articles and papers to many scholarly and professional publications.

He serves on the boards of Children's Medical Center, Tulsa; Arts Council of Tulsa; Hillcrest Medical Center, Tulsa; Thomas Gilcrease Institute of American History and Art; Tulsa Community Chest; Tulsa Civic Ballet; Tulsa Mental Health Association; Undercroft Montessori School, Inc., Tulsa; Oklahoma Council on Economic Education and the Frontiers of Science Foundation, Inc. He is also a member of the St. John's Hospital Advisory Board, Tulsa, and is an ex officio member of the Board of Trustees for the Oklahoma Health Sciences Foundation.

At present he is a member of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, American Academy of Political and Social Science, Omi-



cron Delta Kappa, Phi Delta Kappa, Alpha Phi Omega and First Presbyterian Church.

He is listed in Outstanding Young Men in America, 1966; American Men of Science, 1968; Who's Who in America, 1968-69; Who's Who in American College and University Administration, 1969-70; Leaders in Education, 1970; Community Leaders of America, 1970-71; and Who's Who in the South and Southwest.

He and his wife, the former Joanne Harper of Kansas City, Missouri, have two children, Mark and Lynn.

ball coach at Tulsa until 1966, and was given much of the credit for helping formulate the offenses that kept TU atop national passing statistics and into two consecutive Bluebonnet Bowls.

Dry was an honorable mention all-state football player at Fairland, Okla., where he earned 11 letters in football, basketball, baseball and track. During his senior year, he set a school record for season scoring. He attended college at then Oklahoma A&M, now Oklahoma State, and as a freshman kicked a 30-yard field goal in the last 12 seconds to beat the TU freshmen.

The next three years he played for J. B. Whitworth's Aggies, gaining all-Missouri Valley Conference honors as a senior. He also received honorable

mention All-America as center and linebacker. He later coached the OSU frosh that beat Oklahoma's yearlings, which four years later were national champions.

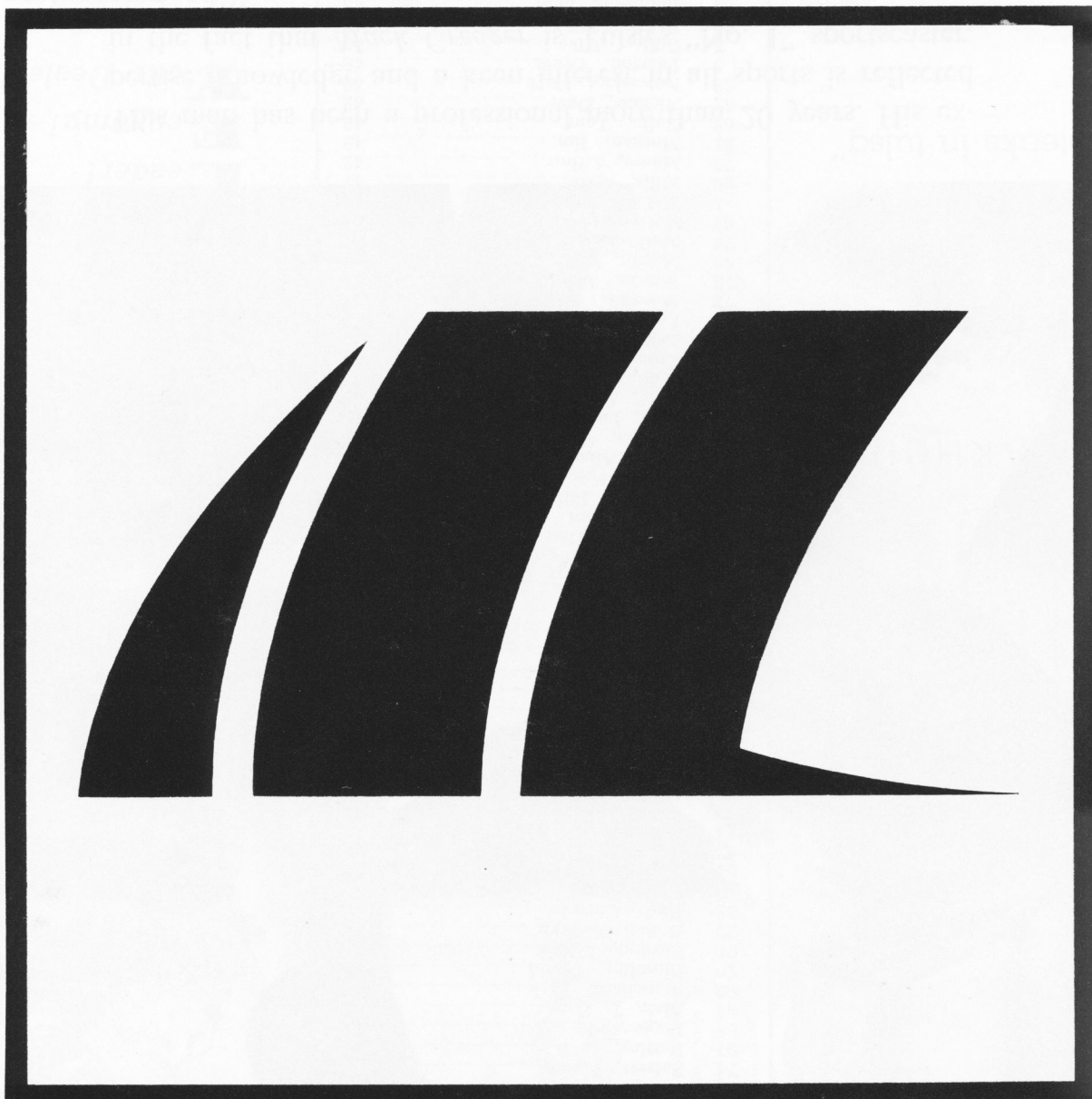
Dry began coaching in Fairland in 1956 and after a 7-3 season went to Tulsa Edison High School as football assistant and head track coach. His track team won a state title in 1958 and the next year he moved to Tulsa Hale High as football coach.

His association with the University of Tulsa began in 1961 when he became offensive line coach and in 1964 he was given the added responsibility of coordinating the offenses that featured Jerry Rhome, Billy Anderson and Howard Twilley. He left in 1966 to join the Oilers.

On February 1, 1971, F. A. Dry became the sixth athletic director at the University of Tulsa at age 39. Dry, who had spent the five previous years as an assistant coach for the Houston Oilers, was an assistant foot-

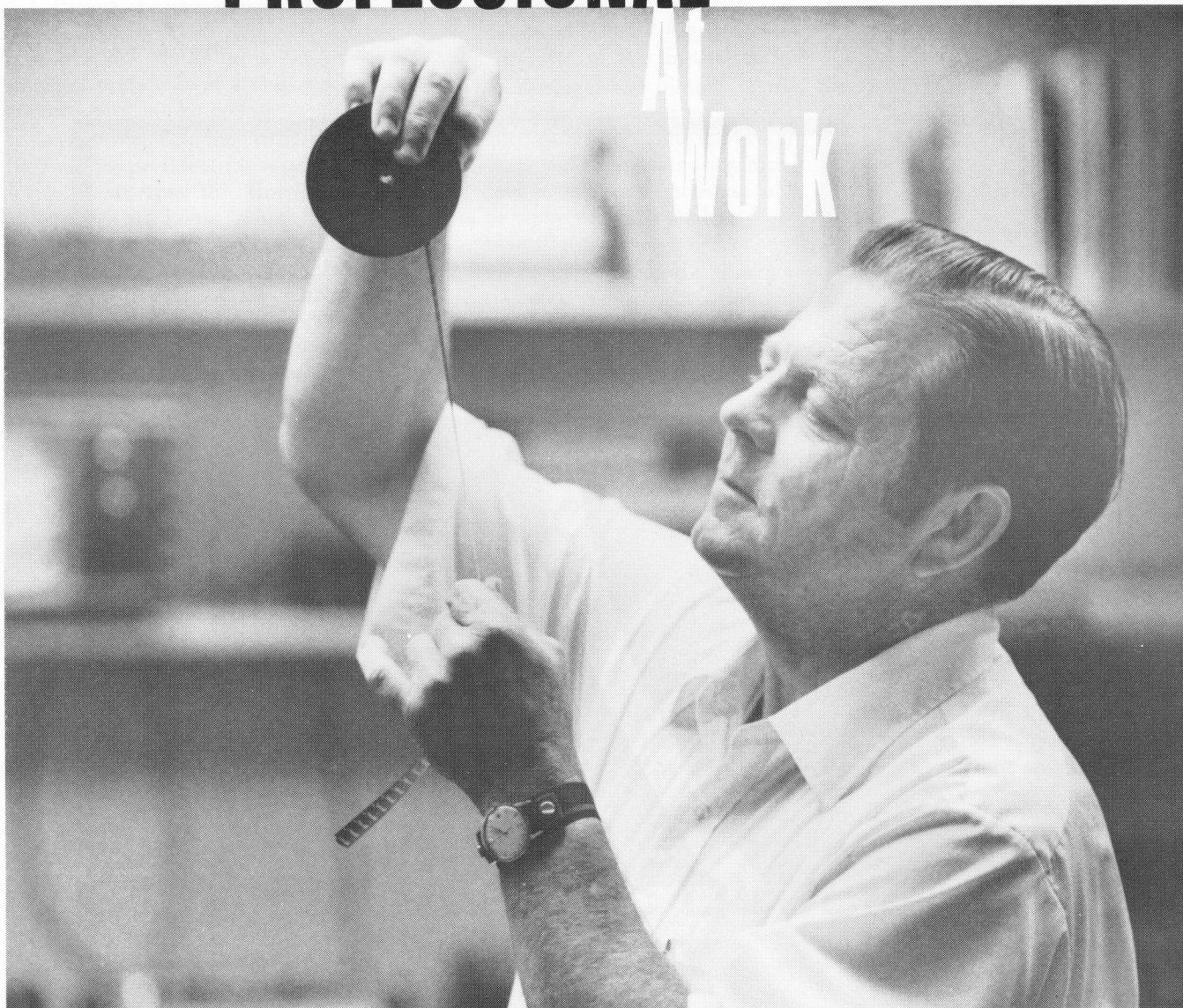

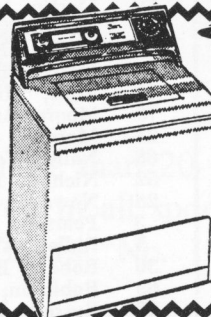

game in Chicago, the Copper Bowl, the Senior Bowl and the coaches All-America game. He received his BS degree in education from North Carolina State.

He was the number three draft choice of the NFL's Chicago Bears and the number seven pick of the San Diego Chargers of the fledgling AFL. After two seasons with the Chargers, he was traded to the Oakland Raiders for another three seasons. His name again went into the record books for punt and kick-off returns — some still

standing — and held the lead in punt returns for 1963 and 1964.

Gibson returned to his alma mater in 1967 as a defensive backfield coach for Earle Edwards. The Wolfpack ravaged the season with an 8-2 record that year and went to the Liberty Bowl. The next year found him with the Boston Patriots and in 1969 he was coaching defensive backs for the Buffalo Bills.

He and his wife, Ethelee, have three children — Terri Lynn, Kimberly Ann, and Michael Andrew.

"Hoot" Says . . .

In approaching our second season at the University of Tulsa, it has been our goal to establish an outstanding organization that will assure success and improvement for the future. We want a total commitment from everyone in the program for our monumental undertaking.

In helping us achieve this goal, we have assembled a fine staff. They are Doug Gerhart, Dennis Chinn, Ted Plumb, Charlie Donaldson, Bob Junko, Tom Ososkie and Greg Williams. Even the secretaries are new.

Certainly our opponents for this fall reflect the most difficult and oppressive schedule in the history of the University. Arkansas, Tennessee and Air Force were ranked in the Top 10 last season. Wake Forest and Louisville won their Conference championships. Vince Gibson at Kansas State has obtained parity with the class teams in the country, having defeated the University of Oklahoma for two consecutive years. Florida State and Virginia Tech are traditionally undefeated powers.

In an effort to be competitive, we have instituted many personnel changes, a trait I learned well from Al Davis in my formative years with the Oakland Raiders.

Our Offensive Line demonstrated tremendous improvement in the Spring from last fall. Jean Barrett, 6-4, 250, and Gary Christensen, 6-3, 245, who we moved from guard to tackle, provide us with good drop back pass protection. The two guards are co-captain Lindsay Anthony and Junior College transfer Mike Mills, who will be competing with Scott Marquis at the starting guard positions. Center remains unsettled, due to the injury of Steve Shores, who was moved from tight end.

At the vital position of quarterback, Todd Starks and Roland Whitehurst both demonstrated leadership ability in Spring Drills. How they will hold up under our competition is yet to be answered. By moving Johnny White from flanker to halfback, we have provided an adequate replacement for Josh Ashton's departure into professional football. Battling for the fullback spot will be Eddie White and Dave Nowaskey.

To compensate for our loss of tackles Joe Garner and Chuck Cummins, we shifted defensive ends Richard Dixon and L. B. Bartley to those positions. Big, sweet Arthur Moore, at 6-6, 250, potentially could develop into a No. 1 draft choice. Rickey Russell, from Albemarle, North Carolina, is the starting right end.

We have more depth at linebacker than at any position on our team. Dick Blanchard and Pedro Williams provide experience at the outside positions. Marc Funk is being strongly challenged by talented Johnny Corbett at middle linebacker. Allan Jones, who has moved from Rover to linebacker, and Mike Kmita both have starting potential.

The most important position on any football team at any level is the Defensive Secondary. We ended Spring Practice without determining a No. 1 unit who are accustomed to working together and coordinating their every move. Ralph McGill, who has moved from free safety to left corner, in my opinion is the best defensive back in America. By moving Jon Long to strong safety, we have the toughness necessary for supporting end runs. At right corner, replacing Harold Williams, is junior George Haynes. We expect Arthur Calloway to be a swingman. Free safety remains unsettled. Sophomore Randy Hawn and senior Jim Morgan must develop quickly. In addition to these two people, we have moved Drane Scrivener to that position from runningback.

Sam Henry, who broke several school records, will provide consistent field goal kicking, and as yet we have not determined a No. 1 punter. Don Chandler, outstanding kicker from the Green Bay Packers, will be assisting us in early drills and the kicking game.

The second chapter in our drive for prominence in football should be a challenging and exciting year. It will be a tremendous thrill to play such teams as Kansas State, Arkansas, Tennessee and Air Force. A respectable performance against these people could greatly assist us with our future growth.

When Claude Gibson left the ranks of professional football in the spring of 1970, it was with the long-range hope of becoming head coach at a university. He could have had little notion that by summer he would find himself in just that position. The resignation of Vince Carillot as the University's head coach that July resulted in head coach that July resulted in "Hoot" being moved up to interim head coach — facing a season that would chill any veteran coach. He accepted the challenge as a rare opportunity to fulfill his career goal at the age of 31.

Coach Gibson not only accepted the challenge, but in spite of the shake-up in coaching staff, a two-year probation blow by the conference and three years by the NCAA, along with formidable opponents, he produced a 6-4 season that fans nearly saw explode to a 9-1 showing except for a couple of frustrating bad breaks. Only the highly-ranked Arkansas Razorbacks completely dominated the Hurricane and only a 14-8 loss to Louisville on a homerun pass stood between his team and the conference championship.

With a winning season season in his resume (best for a rookie coach at the University since Buddy Brother's team in 1946), Gibson was confidently offered a full head coach contract.

The coach began his playing career in Asheville, N.C., in 1954. His prep career included letters in football, basketball and track, a place as all-state halfback, and a line in the record books as a hurdler at track events.

Advancing to North Carolina State, he teamed with Roman Gabriel from 1957 to 1961 and after his senior year participated in the College All-Star

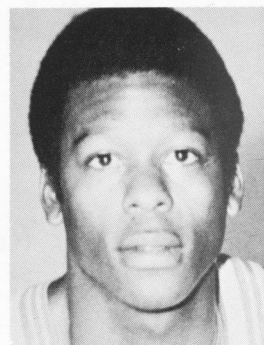
TU Basketball Faces Another Tough Season

Basketball season last March finished a little too soon for basketball coach Ken Hayes. The Hurricane had finally began to string together peak performances with a three-game winning streak on the road to close one game out of a share of the Missouri Valley Conference title.

Sparking that late flurry was guard Steve Bracey, the much heralded junior college transfer who showed the offensive punch that helped him lead the nation in scoring a year earlier at Kilgore Junior College. That impetus gives Hayes and his assistants Jerry Evans and John Rendek a bright note on which to launch the 1971-72 campaign.

Bracey, who finished the season averaging over 18 points a game, will be joined by two-year regular Larry Morris as TU again prepares for a tough schedule in the rugged Missouri Valley Conference. Bracey, a 6-1 guard with more moves than a Swiss watch and a soft outside shooting touch, will be bidding for All-America honors as well as attention from professional scouts.

Tulsa will miss Dana Lewis, who signed a lucrative contract with the Philadelphia 76ers after last season. His rebounding (No. 2 in the league) and scoring punch (led the Valley last year) was a decisive factor the past two seasons. Also gone are Bobbie Horn and John Herndon who added

needed support in rebounding and playmaking, respectively.

Helping take up the slack for height will be junior Joe Voskuhl, who spelled Lewis and Horn at times last season. At 6-8 he is shorter than Lewis but makes up for that with his aggressiveness.

Morris, last year's captain, will return at one forward spot and at the other it will be a fight. The McMullen twins, Donnie and Ronnie, transferred from Bacone and have a shot at the job, along with Eric Smiler, Redshirt Robert Compton, Stan McLaughlin, and Dave Rademeyer.

Smiler is only 6-3, though, and is more suited for a guard slot opposite Bracey. Jim Clessen, a dead-eye gunner from outside, also logged a lot of time last season and there's plenty of depth with letterman Mike Lofstrom and Willie Biles, who led the Golden Gales last year averaging over 31 points a game.

This year's 16-game home schedule offers the Hurricane fans a chance to see, not only the potent Missouri Valley powers, but also Creighton, guided by former Tulsa Central coach Eddie Sutton, Oklahoma City and Texas Tech. All the home games will start at 8 p.m. except the regionally televised game with Memphis State Feb. 26, which will begin at noon.

It's another of those challenges that

taxes the experience of the TU staff, such as Coach Hayes' 51-28 record in three years at the Tulsa helm and the savvy of his aides, former Tulsa star and ex-OMA coach Jerry Evans and John Rendek, who amassed a remarkable record at Male High School in Louisville before joining Hayes' staff.

As guests of the University of Tulsa, your cooperation is requested in maintaining the tradition of neatness and dignity of the university.

We request your help in observing the stadium rules and regulations and the Tulsa tradition of outstanding sportsmanship. We hope the following guide will in making your afternoon a convenient and enjoyable one:

FIELD REGULATIONS

All spectators must keep off of the playing field at all times during the game. At the end of the game, spectators must use the ramp and section exits.

PUBLIC TELEPHONES

Pay stations are located at ground level on both the East and West stands under sections A, H, N and U, and in the upper level of the West stands under sections AA and HH.

REST ROOMS

Rest rooms are located on the West side below sections D and E both under the escalator and the concrete stands, on the East side under sections Q and R and in the North stands under section K.

CONCESSION AREAS

The main concession areas are located under section B and in the center areas below the West stands and below section S on the East side. Additional concession areas can be found on the upper level on the West side and below sections BB and CC, in portable houses on the East side of the stadium and in front of the upper box seats on the West side.

PUBLIC ADDRESS SYSTEM ANNOUNCEMENT

Only emergency announcements will be made on a special basis over the stadium public address during a game. Public service announcements must be cleared well in advance of a home game through the athletic publicity office. Emergency announcements should be delivered to the West press box. Please do not request this service needlessly.

ESCALATOR and WHEEL CHAIR RAMP

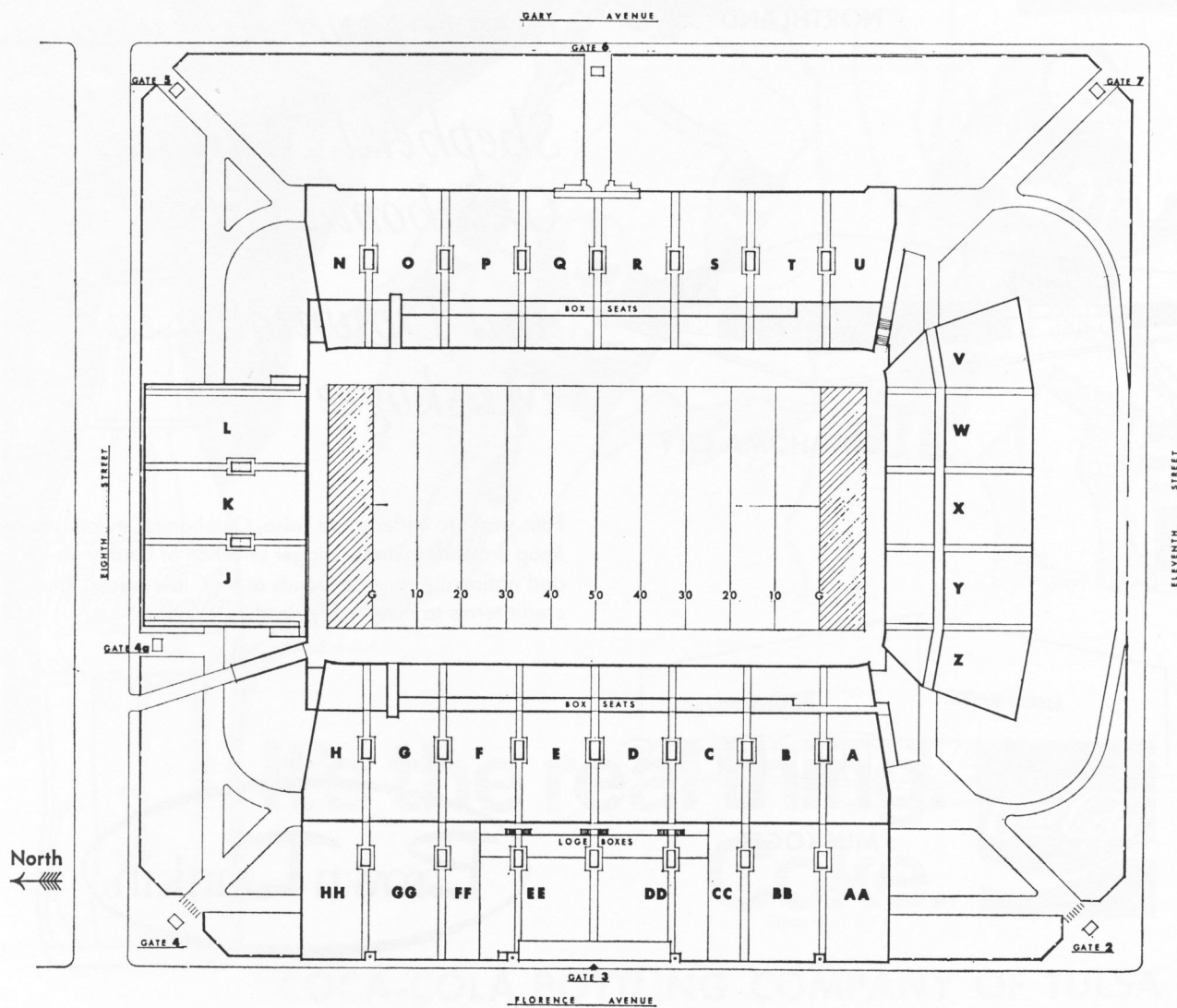

'Minor Sports' Think Major

While the other varsity sports at the University of Tulsa don't draw the attention of football, basketball and baseball, they are making steady climbs in prominence.

Last year's tennis team failed to defend its Missouri Valley Conference title but finished third as new entry West Texas State flexed its well-known net muscles in its conference debut. The Hurricane netmen of coach Don Zimmerman still had a successful season and will have all of last season's regulars back this year.

The golf team, directed by Dr. Carl Oliver, faced one of the toughest schedules in the school's history and managed a winning season, then tied for fifth in the MVC. Guy Walkingstick capped his career by being invited to play in the NCAA golf championships during the summer.

Track made a reappearance with Dr. Mike Davis using student volunteers and some football loanees to finish fifth in the conference indoor hurdles meet and seventh in the outdoor championships. James Shaw tied a conference hurdles mark, Jim Morgan set a school high jump record and Ron Weigleb was third in the league shot put competition.

Swimming was added to the sports program during the summer on a non-scholarship basis with Phil Brougher, former swim coach at TCU, offering to coach any swim-

mers at TU who are interested in forming a team. Brougher coaches the Tulsa Hurricane Swim Club, formerly the University Club Swim Team, which will use the pool in Mabee Gymnasium for its workouts.

While it's a meager start, it offers a more complete program at the University and could provide a boost in the all-sports race in the conference. Last year TU finished second and with improvements in the track competition and possible scoring now in swimming, the Hurricane has an excellent chance at all-sports trophy.

GENE SHELL'S BASEBALLERS FINISH THIRD IN NATION

Baseball at the University of Tulsa has risen under the direction of Gene Shell to a position of prominence on the national collegiate scene. In six seasons Shell has taken TU baseball from a modest schedule against mostly state college competition to one of the most prestigious schedules in the country and two trips to the College World Series.

Last spring the Golden Hurricane faced a rebuilding job at many key positions as professional contracts and graduation removed many proven performers. With the predictable yeomen chores from a couple of veteran pitchers and the unexpected offensive power of a pair of rookies right out of the Oklahoma high school circles, TU not only brought home a third straight Missouri Valley Conference title but added its second District Five championship in three years to qualify for the College World Series.

The Hurricane had several chances to get discouraged and fold but there was enough of a mixture of rookie enthusiasm and veteran steadfastness to keep the ship sailing. Epitomizing this dogged determination was the way TU bounced back from a disheartening extra-inning loss to Bradley in the winners bracket to the conference tournament. The Hurricane had to then eliminate Memphis State in the loser's bracket and defeat Bradley twice in a row — and that was just what happened.

TU then awaited the outcome of the Big Eight Conference race before sweeping a two-game series from Iowa State, which had one year earlier upset the Hurricane. Cliff Butcher, one of the aces of the Tulsa staff, had to hit his only collegiate home run to win the first game and then his fraternity brother and mound mate Steve Rogers blanked the Cyclones to nail down a berth in the NCAA finals at Omaha.

In the process both those pitchers were named to the all-conference team with first baseman Jerry Tabb, second-sacker Roger Adams, shortstop Phil Honeycutt and outfielder Steve Bowling. Tabb and Bowling were freshmen who continually provided timely hitting as well as the longball while Adams and Honeycutt chipped in with the bat and pivotal double-play combinations.

The rankings after TU reached the the College World Series had the Hurricane fourth, four notches above the highest spot Tulsa had reached all season. As they did two years earlier when picked to be one of the first teams to be eliminated, Shell's charges again overcome the odds and rolled past Mississippi State, Harvard and Southern Illinois to remain the only unbeaten team after four days.

Then, defending champion Southern California took advantage of TU errors to throw the finals into a three-team struggle with Southern Illinois,

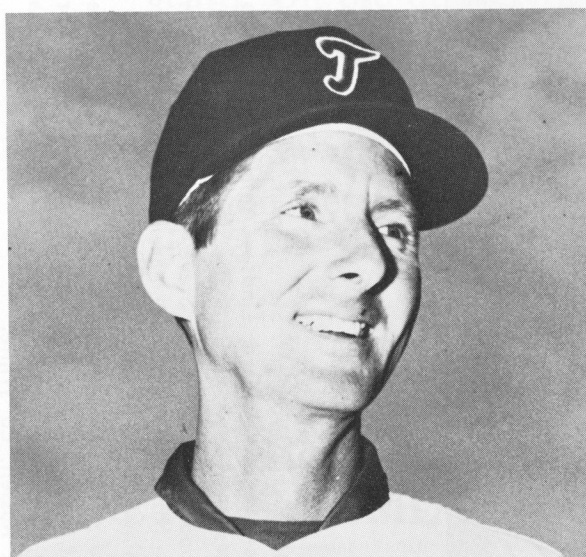
all three teams with one loss. Southern Illinois won the flip for the bye and the next night the eventual champion Trojans edged the Hurricane with an unearned run in the ninth inning.

Tabb again achieved unparalleled heights for a rookie, receiving the Most Valuable Player award for the Series and joined Rogers and Bowling on the all-tournament team. Capping an unbelievable year for the freshmen slugger from Altus was his selection to play for the U.S. baseball team in the Pan-American Games in Cali, Colombia, where he again walked off with honors.

With Bowling and Tabb coming back along with eight other returnees from last season's club, Shell has recruited a hassle of stars from Oklahoma and promises that TU baseball fortunes should still offer the Tulsa fans the best in college baseball.

During Shell's seven-year stint at TU, the Hurricane has won 160 games and lost 49 for a winning percentage of .780. He has been named Coach of the Year in the conference after winning the title the last three years in a row and twice has been District 5 Coach of the Year. Last winter Shell was named to the National Rules Committee representing the district.

Four seniors from the 1971 squad went into professional baseball after the third place finish at Omaha — Rogers, Adams, Honeycutt and relief pitcher Reggie Rowe.
