

#### "BRING ME MEN"

Bring me men to match my mountains Bring me men to match my plains Men with empires in their purpose And new eras in their brains.

Those few words from the poem "The Coming American" by the late Sam Walter Foss very appropriately describe the cadets who make up the Air Force Academy, youngest of the nation's service academies.

What does it take to produce such men?

For one thing, four very difficult years at the Air Force Academy, years marked by tough requirements in discipline, study and physical endurance. Those who pass the requirements have committed themselves to a life of high moral standards and service to their country. These men eventually will be the backbone of the Air Force and will form the nucleus of career officers dedicated to aerospace purposes.

The Air Force Academy began on a hot day in July, 1955, when the first class of 306 cadets was sworn in at Lowry Air Force Base in Denver. It's been only 19 years since that day but the Air Force Academy has come a long way since then.

First of all, there is a unique "major for all" program. A cadet receives a general undergraduate education together with an academic major in one of 21 fields. They are available within the fields of science, engineering, social studies and humanities. For the exceptional cadet, there is an in-depth graduate program.

Since its birth in Denver, the Academy has moved to a majestic complex of buildings located on a rolling, 18,000 acre pine-covered site in the foothills of the Rampart Range of the Rocky Mountains north of Colorado Springs. One of the top tourist attractions in the state, the Academy combines natural with architectural beauty. The backdrop of the Rockies blends in with the gleaming facades of the academic and residence halls.

Unlike a civilian college or university, life at the Air Force Academy is based on rigid daily schedule, strict discipline and constant emphasis on what it takes to become a leader. Through this, the cadet learns the fundamental military knowledge and skills required of a junior officer, skills which develop him toward the highest command and staff positions.

New buildings, new subjects, new recreational facilities and new ideas will help keep the Academy vital and in tune with the times. It will help turn out better men for the most complex and challenging jobs in the U.S. Air Force.

#### MISSION

To provide instruction and experience to each cadet so that he graduates with the knowledge and character essential to leadership and with the motivation to become a career officer in the United States Air Force.

Guiding the Air Force Academy athletic program is the Air Force Academy Athletic Association.

The Association is an unincorporated, nonprofit organization established as a nonappropriated fund activity of the Department of the Air Force. It is an organization through which the Academy superintendent exercises control over the intercollegiate athletic program.

The Association is governed by an executive committee consisting of five members — the faculty representative of intercollegiate athletics, who will act as chairman; the director of athletics, who will serve as president of the Association; a representative of the dean of faculty; the vice commandant of cadets; and the Academy chief of staff.

Current members of the executive committee are: Colonel Philip Erdle, chairman; Colonel George Nelson; Colonel Frank Merritt; Colonel James P. Mc-Carthy and Colonel Marcos Kinevan.

The purpose of the Association is to support the 18-sport intercollegiate program, as well as several others on the junior varsity and freshman levels; maintain athletic facilities; provide supplies and equipment; employ coaching and administrative staff; and support the intramural and physical education programs.



## MAJ. GEN. JAMES R. ALLEN SUPERINTENDENT

Major General James R. Allen became superintendent of the Air Force Academy on Aug. 1, succeeding Lieutenant General Albert P. Clark, who retired.

General Allen came to the Academy after serving as special assistant to the Air Force chief of staff for B-1 bomber matters at Headquarters, U.S. Air Force, Washington, D.C.

Before serving in Washington, General Allen was chief of staff at Strategic Air Command headquarters, Offutt Air Force Base, Neb.

A native of Louisville, Ky., General Allen graduated from West Point in 1948 and received his pilot's wings a year later at Nellis AFB, Nev. During the Korean War he flew two combat tours in the P-51 aircraft.

From June 1953 to 1956 he was assigned to the U.S. Military Academy at West Point where he served as a company tactical officer.

In 1965, he commanded the 4th Tactical Fighter Squadron in Florida, then went to Vietnam where he flew F-4C aircraft as deputy commander for operations of the 12th Tactical Fighter Wing.

General Allen was assigned to Headquarters, U.S. Air Force in August 1968 and held staff positions there until becoming commander of the 19th Air Division in Texas in January, 1972. He served there until August, 1972, when he moved to Strategic Air Command headquarters.

A command pilot, General Allen has attended the Army Command and General Staff College and the Industrial College of the Armed Forces. He has a master of science degree in business administration from George Washington University.

His decorations include the Legion of Merit with two oak leaf clusters, Distinguished Flying Cross with one oak leaf cluster, Bronze Star Medal, Air Medal with 11 oak leaf clusters, Air Force Commendation Medal with one oak leaf cluster and the Army Commendation Medal.



### COL. FRANK MERRITT DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Colonel Frank Merritt, fifth athletic director in Air Force Academy history, is in charge of one of the most extensive athletic and physical education programs in the nation.

A native of New Jersey, Col. Merritt assumed the athletic director duties in June, 1967. He has watched the Academy grow steadily and was one of the original staff members, serving as assistant athletic director from 1955 until 1959.

Col. Merritt is a 1944 graduate of West Point, and as an undergraduate was a starting tackle on the Army football teams of 1942 and 1943, receiving All-America honors both years. Since then, he has posted a distinguished record as a U.S. Air Force officer.

A veteran of 130 tactical air missions during the Korean Conflict, Col. Merritt compiled an impressive record following his first tour at the Air Force Academy. He was the first airlift commander at Leopoldville, Congo, in support of the United Nations operation and also has served as mission commander for the airlift of U.N. troops into Kindu and Goma and for transporting Ethiopian troops into Katanga. He also was vitally involved in the troop movement during the Berlin Crisis of 1961-62.

After returning to the United States in 1963, he attended the Naval War College in Newport, R.I., and received his master of arts degree in international affairs from George Washington University.

A command pilot, Col. Merritt's decorations include the Legion of Merit, Distinguished Flying Cross, Bronze Star, Air Medal with five oak leaf clusters, Joint Service Commendation Medal with oak leaf cluster and the Air Force Commendation Medal with two oak leaf clusters.



MAJOR HANK EGAN HEAD BASKETBALL COACH

Major Hank Egan begins his fourth year as head varsity coach, after serving as freshman coach for two seasons and chief scout and recruiter during the 1970-71 season. From 1966 to 1968 he was the Academy's junior varsity basketball coach.

In his first three seasons as head coach Egan has guided the Falcons to a 37-36 combined record, including a 14-10 mark during the 1972-73 season, the Falcons' first winning season in seven years. He had an 18-6 record as head freshman coach, posting excellent 9-3 marks in both 1969 and 1970.

He is a native of New York City where he earned all-city basketball honors at Brooklyn Prep High School. After his graduation in 1955, he entered Niagara University and was captain of the freshman team as well as being the class president before his appointment to the Naval Academy.

At Navy, Coach Egan earned three varsity letters as a guard and twice played on teams that appeared in national collegiate playoffs.

After graduation in 1960 he chose the Air Force and was stationed at Whiteman AFB, Mo., and Newfoundland before being transferred to Colorado.

He continued to play basketball for several years, including two seasons of service ball and a year with a Topeka, Kan., A.A.U. team. He has also coached on both the military and National A.A.U. levels.

In June 1972 he was the Air Force liaison for the U.S. Olympic Basketball Team Trials held at the Academy.

Coach Egan and his wife, Judy, are the parents of two children, a son, John, 11, and a daughter, Kelly, 8.

#### THE AIDES



#### **MAJOR REGGIE MINTON**

Major Reggie Minton begins his fourth year as assistant varsity coach after two years as assistant freshman coach. A native of Bridgeport, Conn., he graduated from College at Wooster, Ohio, in 1963 where he was a four-year letterman in basketball as a guard and forward. His last two years he was co-captain of the team and won all-conference honors his senior year. Major Minton has played on numerous Air Force service teams and made the All-Air Force squad for five straight years starting in 1964. He was also an alternate on the 1964 U.S. Olympic team. As player coach of the basketball team at South Ruislip Air Station in England, his teams posted a 65-24 record in three seasons, twice winning the United Kingdom title. In 1964, the team finished as Air Force runnerup and Air Force Europe champion in 1969. In June 1972, he was one of the coaches at the U.S. Olympic Basketball Team Trials.

#### CAPT. FRED BUDINGER

One of the top basketball players in Air Force history, Captain Fred Budinger is beginning his third year as head junior varsity coach. A 1967 graduate of the Academy, he holds the Falcon season record for consecutive free throws (23) and free throw percentage (.819). The sixth-leading Air Force scorer of all time (948 points and a 13.0 average), Captain Budinger is also among the top 10 career leaders in field goal and rebounds. A three-year starter at both guard and forward, he was the Falcon team captain in 1967 and its most valuable player. A native of Tolono, III., he graduated from Unity High School in 1963 where he earned All-State honorable mention. Captain Budinger spent two years assigned to Naha Air Base in Okinawa from 1969 to 1971 before a tour in Southeast Asia. He flew a total of 365 missions as a forward air controller and his decorations include the Distinguished Flying Cross, 11 Air Medals and the Republic of Vietnam Cross of Gallantry twice.

### COL. ROBERT R. LOCHRY Officer Representative

Colonel Robert R. Lochry, permanent professor and head of the department of mathematics, is serving his fourth year as the officer representative for the Falcon basketball team.

In this capacity, he is the liaison between the basketball team and the academic department and is the administrative head of the squad on all trips away from the Academy.

A graduate of the U.S. Military Academy, Colonel Lochry holds a bachelor's and master's degree from Rensselaer Institute and a Ph.D. from the University of California.




Jim Eken (44), top rebounder on the 1974 Falcon team, goes in for a layup against the Merchant Marine Academy last season.


## 12 — JEFF GRAVES, 6-2, 160-pound senior guard, Canton, Ohio, (Jefferson)

Super-sub may very aptly describe this year's cocaptain. Last season Jeff started less than half the games but came off the bench several times to spark rallies. Graves is again expected to be the quarterback on offense this season, and his leadership ability and basketball sense makes him a strong candidate for that position. Last season's fifth leading scorer, Jeff had his best games against San Diego State in which he netted 10 points and against Northern Colorado with 11 points. His quickness and reactions are best used on defense pressuring opponent guards, and he is rated as the best ball handler on the team. He majors in management.

#### 30 — DAN KRAFT, 6-2, 175-pound senior guard, Dayton, Ohio, (Glenwood)

This season's co-captain, Dan is the top scorer returning from last year's squad. He averaged 13.8 points per contest, and had his best evening against Pan American when he netted 23 points. Other top outputs included 22 in an upset win over Oregon and 19 against Navy. One of the best pure shooters on the team, Dan is considered deadly from 15 to 20 feet and isn't too bad on rebounds either as he garnered just under four a contest for the fifth best mark on last year's squad. Strong on defense, Dan should be a valuable compliment to a solid backcourt attack this year. A life sciences major, Dan holds a 3.09 grade point average.

#### 15 — BOB DJOKOVICH, 6-3, 180pound freshman, Gary, Ind., (Wallace)



He is expected to see plenty of action this season, and brings to the team some impressive credentials from high school. At Wallace H. S. he was first team all area, and was also an all-state honorable mention and All-American honorable mention his senior year. Bob's dad was once a professional soccer player. Besides three prep letters in basketball, Bob also displayed his versatility by lettering four years on the tennis team.

### 44 — JIM EKEN, 6-4, 200-pound senior, Lincoln, Mo., (Benton)

Although he stands six feet four inches, Jim, in basketball, is one of those good things that come in small packages. An excellent junior for his size, he led the squad in rebounds last season with nearly nine a game, and was the squad's top rebounder in 17 of 24 starts. A good shooter from the outside, he was also the squad's third leading scorer last season with a 12.4 average. He had his best game against Wyoming and Denver with 19 each, and scored in double figures in 18 of 24 games, including a string of 10 points or better in the first six games of the season. Besides his offensive scoring skills, Jim is a team player, coming with the third leading assist total on the team. A two-year letterman, he is again expected to be one of the dominant figures in the front court Falcon attack. Jim majors in management.





### **CADET FIELD HOUSE RATES WITH BEST**

One of the most impressive sports buildings in the country is the Air Force Academy's field house, a modern versatile structure with seemingly endless uses.

The \$5.6 million building is five stories high and 396 feet by 426 feet, the size of three football fields laid side by side.

The structure is divided into three areas: basketball arena, ice hockey arena and a massive multipurpose area. The three sections have a combined seating capacity of 11,000.

The building provides space for competition in basketball, indoor track, wrestling, fencing, gymnastics, lacrosse and ice hockey.

Practice facilities are also available for football, basketball, track, soccer, golf, and tennis, as well as for intramural events.

Both Tartan and Astroturf surfaces were utilized in the building. The basketball court and indoor track are covered with Tartan surfaces. The basketball court is not as hard as the conventional wooden courts and provides good traction.

The one-sixth-mile track also is covered with Tartan surface, but a rougher version. It requires less maintenance than the normal track, and provides greater traction to the runners.

Inside the track is a netted area, 119 by 125 feet, which includes a baseball infield and half of a football field.

Spectators for both the hockey and basketball games are seated above the playing surface, with participants on the lower level. The lower level includes dressing rooms, supply areas, medical rooms and laundry.

Also on this level are the offices of the department of athletics.

The hockey arena, where one of the 1969 National Collegiate Championship games was contested, seats 3,400.

One of the innovations is a press box located between the hockey and basketball arenas. It's 80 feet long, and allows reporters to observe both areas from a single vantage point.



### THE AIR FORCE ACADEMY

- ......is located 10 miles north of Colorado Springs (metropolitan population 290,000) at the base of the Rampart Range of the Rocky Mountains.
- ......has one of the nation's largest college campuses with 18,000 acres. In addition to the main cadet academic area, the Academy has two housing areas with more than 1400 homes for support personnel, a high school, two elementary schools, a shopping center, hospital, the Academy Preparatory School, a vehicle service and supply area, a golf course and a landing area that serves the light plane, sailplane and parachuting activities of the cadet airmanship program.
- ......was authorized by Congress April 1, 1954, and the first class entered July, 1955, at temporary facilities at Lowry AFB, Denver. The Cadet Wing moved into its permanent facilities near Colorado Springs in August, 1958, and the first class graduated in June, 1959.
- draws more than 1½ million tourists each year, making it one of Colorado's top tourist attractions. The Academy's biggest attraction is its 17-spire, all-faith chapel which is 150-feet high and is divided into sections for Protestant, Catholic, Jewish and other faiths. Graduation week, known as June Week, also is a big attraction.
- ......has more than 100 miles of paved roads. Mule deer, wildcats, coyote, porcupines, weasels, squirrels, jack rabbits and cottontails, bear, raccoon and elk can be found on the Academy site.
- ......is one of the nation's highest campuses. The altitude varies from 6,340 to 8.040 feet. The academic area, which is 7,200 feet above sea level, is remarkably appropriate as the location to educate future leaders for space technology and exploration.
- ......has a Cadet Wing of approximately 4,200 cadets and 40 squadrons with an authorized strength of 4,417. The cadets are housed in two dorms, one of which is Vandenberg Hall, the largest building at the Academy.
- ......offers a commission as a second lieutenant in the U.S. Air Force and bachelor of science degree to its graduates. The balanced program of instruction requires a cadet to take 145½ semester hours of academics, 27 semester hours of military training and 14½ semester hours of physical education. Upon graduation, cadets have a military commitment of five years.
- ......has a teaching faculty that consists entirely of military officers, all volunteers, who have established outstanding records of performance and career dedication. Faculty members are required to earn master's degrees in their fields and many obtain doctorates.
- ......conducts a pilot orientation and navigation training program.
